Gladstone Region Mayor Matt Burnett said community members should look out for the Rugby League legend in social media and on radio and television delivering important information about how to prepare for natural disasters.

"As we know only too well in the Gladstone Region, when it comes to extreme weather events, it's not a matter of 'if' but 'when'," Councillor Burnett said.

"Community members should understand there is a risk of experiencing a natural disaster, but the impact can be reduced.

"We have just had the launch of Get Ready Week across Queensland for 2019 so the message of being prepared and knowing how to put an emergency plan together for your family or business, can never be repeated enough."
