Athletes that place first, second and third at this event qualify for the State Little Athletics Carnival usually held in Brisbane or Townsville.

Assessment Comments	 The Panel assessed this application consistently across all key selection criteria, highlighting the events' potential to drive positive community outcomes and attracting visitation to the local area. The Panel noted the in-kind contribution of marquee hire from council was not valued, therefore was not requested clearly in the application. It was mentioned that the applicant possibly undervalued the economic benefit an event of this kind can bring to the region.



	The Panel discussed the eligibility of some expenses however were clear on their support for the event and the positive economic impact it will bring.

Event Summary:	 Baffle Creek Family Fishing Festival (FFF) is in its eighth year. Hosted by the Baffle Creek Fishing Club who took over managing the event in 2019. Local and visiting recreation fishers take to the waters around Baffle Creek as often as they chose during the weeklong event, vying for great prizes. The competition encourages sustainable fishing practices and is purely 'Catch, Snap and Release' as our fish stocks and the health of our river systems are important to us. At the end of the fun filled week of fishing and exploring the local sports grounds come to life with bush style entertainment, festival and fun for all. The event provides significant economic benefits to the Baffle Creek community including a means to showcase the magic and lifestyle of Baffle Creek to the outside world - the positive exposure is integral to nurturing opportunities for local eco-sustainable industries e.g. ecotourism and fresh food production.

The panel noted that the recommendation can only be made based on information available at the time of assessment and the committee has provided sufficient evidence to support the hosting
	 of a COVID safe event. The panel noted the events benefit to the local economy by sourcing local goods and services and noted its alignment with other fishing festivals and fishing tourism activities in the region. The panel noted this event provides an opportunity for Council to promote regional RV & Drive tourism.

Assessment Comments	• While there is a significant increase in the funding amount requested compared to Council's previous commitments the application details could not justify this increase.
	• The panel discussed the appropriateness of requested sponsorship of expenses for food and drinks considering these will likely return profit to the club as they are on sold.

Sponsorship request equates to 24% of the total event cost.
Event Summary:	 The Gladstone Community Open Day is held annually in the Gladstone Ports Corporation Marina Parklands. It is a fun, energetic and educational day aimed to display the great work the Emergency Services do in the region. Crews from the Gladstone SES, QFES, QAS, QLD Police and Gladstone Marine Rescue attend and showcase the importance of their service within the community. The Capricorn Rescue helicopter touches down at the event, allowing the community to interact with the helicopter and chat to the crew. For the past two years, the Community Open Day was hosted in conjunction with River Glow Gladstone. This year RACQ Capricorn Helicopter Rescue Service has decided to bring Colour Me Capricorn to Gladstone this year. Participants are encouraged to run, walk, dance or stroll their way along the garden path, covering the Gladstone Ports Corporation Marina Parklands in a cloud of colour! Two distance options (2.5km & 5km) to cater for everyone. Assessment Comments	 The panel scored this application strongly against all key selection criteria, particularly driving social and community outcomes including community pride and cohesion. All expenses applied for are ineligible as per the funding guidelines. The panel commented that while the application was strong and demonstrated good economic activity and the ability to attract external visitation it could not overlook that all items requested were listed as ineligible within the funding guideline.
Panel Recommendation	 The panel has recommended partial funding to be used toward engaging technical officials for the event as described in the funding application. \$1,500 cash investment

Assessment Comments	• The overall KSC score of 51% demonstrates that the application has provided limited evidence of benefit across all key selection criteria.
	• This is primarily due to the lack of evidence provided to support claims made within the application.
	The panel noted both the Gladstone Regional Event Strategy and the Regional Visitor Economy Strategy documents were attached



	there was no attempt made to link these strategies with the event outcomes.
	• The panel discussed the eligibility of some expenses noting that trophies and prizes were considered ineligible and that track upgrade works were likely a part of ongoing costs rather than being event specific.
	• The application lacked justification for such a significant investment for the event.
	• The panel noted the event had great potential, however the application that has been submitted by the Club does not meet the funding criteria. Based on this application the Panel could not recommend support in the interest of maintaining the integrity of the program and the Community Investment Policy.
	• The Club have advised that a Grant Writer was engaged to compile the application, which is a disappointing result that the criteria has not been addressed appropriately.
Panel	• To be considered eligible a minimum of two objectives must be met. The following are examples of the criteria that has not been addressed to the expected standard: -
Recommendation	 Economic Impact – How the event will generate economic activity in the Gladstone Region.
	Destination – Enhances the profile and appeal of the Gladstone Region.
	 Social & Community – Drives social and community outcomes, including community pride and social cohesion.
	 Council should maintain its integrity with respect to assessment of applications against the Council approved assessment process and policy.
	• Feedback with respect to the submission will be provided to the Club and Council may decide to allow an amended application to be considered under this funding program.
