Budding school artists called to enter Australia Day competition

"Artworks will be judged by Gladstone Regional Council Manager Arts and Entertainment, Kim Marxsen, and the winning artists from each section will receive some fantastic prizes, such as their winning entry printed as 2022 Gladstone Regional Council Australia Day commemorative postcards and a Gladstone Cinemas family pass," Cr Churchill added.

"Winners will be announced during Gladstone Regional Council's Australia Day Celebrations on Wednesday, 26 January 2022."

A virtual print making workshop hosted by local artist Leanne Cole will be available online from 10 December to assist budding artists with their entries.
