- 2. Provide \$20,000 funding to GEA to deliver "Scaling your business. Creating your jump" using Shirlaws to run the program
- 3. Delegate authority to the Chief Executive Offcier to put contracts and KPIs in place for each project.

Background:

Two requests from industry groups have been received by Council (attached) to provide funding for programs that they intend to deliver within the community.

The first funding request was received from the Gladstone Chamber of Commerce and Industry (GCCI) to support delivering outcomes that build economic sustainability in the Gladstone Region. It was made up of fours programs that they want to deliver. They are:-

- 1. Reboot and Extend the 'Buy Local' program
- 2. Coordinate/Facilitate Traders Groups
- 3. Content Marketing for Business
- 4. Establishing Collaborative Partnerships

More details on each of these programs is contained in the attached letter from GCCI including the nominated outcomes in each program.

The second funding request was from Gladstone Engineering Alliance (GEA). The funding request was for them to deliver a specific program to help small and medium sized business to "jump" their business from one level to the next. This program has been developed by an international business, Shirlaws, and it is designed to help business highlight and avoid stall points in their growth. It has been used world wide in order to help businesses grow without stalling in their growth.

It would be delivered as a conference to up to 120 businesses from across the Gladstone Region, with follow up group discussions and one-on-one mentoring this project delivers a series of topics specifically to assist businesses grow more quickly.

Communication and Consultation (Internal/External):

There has only been consultation with the groups involved with the funding requests.

Legal Environmental and Policy Implications:

This funding is in line with the council economic development policy that encourages groups to develop their own projects and for Council to determine which are priority projects for the region. These priority projects can then apply for funding to help deliver these projects.

Financial and Resource Implications:

In the 2016/17 budget there has been \$100,000 allocated towards economically significant projects. Currently none of this money has been spent or allocated towards a specific project.
